Here are several family-friendly and individual service ideas for engaging in the Two Lights for Tomorrow Day of Service on April 19, 2025. These ideas honor the spirit of unity, independence, and service- there are also some suggestions incorporating Easter themes of renewal, hope, and compassion.

## General Community Service Ideas

1. **Neighborhood Cleanup:** Walk as a family and pick up litter in a park, around a church, or along sidewalks.
2. **Handwritten Letters to Veterans or Elderly:** Write encouraging notes to those in nursing homes or veterans' homes, thanking them for their service and sacrifice.
3. **Deliver Baked Goods or Meals:** Make cookies or simple meals and deliver them to a neighbor, first responder, or a family in need.
4. **Support a Food Bank:** Gather non-perishable food items as a family and donate them to a local food pantry.
5. **Flag Placement at Cemeteries:** Visit a local cemetery to place small American flags at veterans' graves as a sign of remembrance.
6. **Donate Books or Clothing:** Sort through gently used books and clothes and donate them to a shelter, library, or nonprofit.
7. **Anonymous Kindness:** pay for someone's meal, give flowers to an elderly person, etc.

## Service Ideas with a Christian Easter Connection

1. **Easter Blessing Baskets:** Assemble small baskets with food, hygiene items, or encouraging notes and deliver them to struggling families or the homeless.
2. **"Resurrection Garden" Service Project:** Plant flowers or a small "resurrection garden" (a symbolic garden with an empty tomb) at a church, home, or community space as a sign of renewal and faith.
3. **Easter Card Outreach:** Make Easter-themed cards with Bible verses of hope and deliver them to hospitals, nursing homes, or prison ministries.
4. **Host a Family Prayer Walk:** Walk around your neighborhood or church while praying for families, leaders, and the nation, reflecting on themes of hope and freedom.
5. **Read Scripture to the Elderly:** Visit a nursing home or shut-in and read Easter passages from the Bible as a way to share faith and encouragement.
6. **Easter Story Time for Kids:** Volunteer to read the Easter story or other uplifting books at a library, Sunday school, or community center.
7. **"Acts of Light" Challenge:** Encourage family members to do small, quiet acts of kindness throughout the day—holding the door open, writing a kind note, or sharing an Easter treat with a friend.
